## **Explanation of Variances**

Total Box 3 5,285 7,021

An increase in Other Income has arised due to the increased Community Infrastructure Levy received this year from HDC of £5,865.79 (2014/15 £2732.76) and the overal increase is less due a decrease in the VAT refunded, recycling credit, and interest received in the year compared to 2014/15.

Total Box 6 9,599 19,288

Costs for 2015-16 have increased because:

CIL Reserves and income has been spent on 2 vehicles activated signs to improve highways safety.

General Village and HA Playing Maintenance costs for 2015/16 were not not as much as incurred in 2014/15 as 2014/15 substantial playground repairs to the wetpour was required and several trees needed tree maintenance, these costs were not incurred again in 2015/16.

Street lighting maintenance and electricity costs for 2014-15 did not include any charges for maintenance due to late invoicing by Balfour Beatty, therefore 2015-16 costs include therefore annual maintenance charges for 2014-15 & 2015-16. Also a survey of our street lights was carried out at a cost of £500 to ascertain the condition of each column/lighting unit. The net effect is an increase from  $2014/15 \pm 2,435$  to  $2015/6 \pm 4,390.56$ .

Website hosting and maintenance costs in 2015/16 are reduced from 2014/15 as no agency software upgrade costs were necessary this year, and the maintenance of the website now maintained by a volunteer at minimum cost. Also costs for 2015/6 Parish Magazine were not received in 2015/16. Therefore, the net effect is a reduction in costs from 2014/15 £255.48 to 2015/16 £66.59.

Another cost incurred in 2015-16 and not in 2014/15 was a contribution to community transport within the village.

Vat recoverable has increased due to an increase in expenditure (2014/15 £893.13 - 2015/16 £2,466.40)

Box 7 Total 60,238 60,526

Hemingford Abbots Parish Council own the heritage street lamps within the village and therefore have a Lighting Sinking Fund as a provision for replacement of these units in the next few years (£46,168). Other reserves equate to £14,358 which includes a Community Infrastructure Levy earmarked Reserve of £788.

Total Box 9 94,108 101,918

The value of Fixed Assets has increased due to the purchase of 2 x vehicle activated signs for the village at a cost of £7,810.
