Costs for 2016-7 have increased because:

Other costs in 2016/17 not incurred in 2015/16 included election costs of £105, Section 137 grant of £200 and bank service charges of £54. However, the insurance premium was paid in April instead of March this year, for 2017/18 and therefore does not appear in the total costs for 2016/17, giving rise to a favourable variance of £595 on insurance costs compared to last year.

Stationery, Postage costs were less in 2016/17 by £162.15, no expense was spent on Community Transport in 2016/17 saving £250. However, Parish Magazine/website costs increased from £66.69 to £676.38, due to two years printing cost bills being received in 2016/17 and none in 2015/16.

HA Playing Fields Maintenance costs for 2016/17 were not not as much as incurred in 2015/16 as substantial playground repairs to the wetpour was required and several trees needed tree maintenance in 2015/16 but not in 2016/17. However an earmarked reserve for HA Playing Fields Equipment repair and maintenance has been created as it is expected that costs will increase substantially due to the age of the equipment. (2016/17 £45, 2015/16 £551). Grass and Hedge cutting costs have increased by £270, this is mainly due to the improvement in the weather in 2016/17 therefore more cuts were able to be completed and additional areas added to the cutting programme.

2015-16 street lighting maintenance costs, due to late invoicing by Balfour Beatty, included annual maintenance charges for two years 2014-15 & 2015-16; in 2016/17 only one years annual maintenance costs were incurred at a lower rate. In 2015/16 costs for a survey of our street lights at £500 was incurred to ascertain the condition of each column/lighting unit to assist in developing a plan for the replacement/upgrade of the Parish owned street lighting stock, this cost was not incurred in 2016/17. The net effect is an decrease from 2015/6 £4,390.56 to 2016/7 2,718.88.

Transfer from the CIL Reserve of £634.38 has been spent on 2 poles for vehicles activated signs to improve highways safety. A transfer from the Streeting Lighting Sinking Fund Reserve of £27,226.15 was spent on partial replacement and upgrade of the street lighting stock, and £801.47 was spent on replacement and upgrade of IT Equipment. Therefore the expenditure on vehicles activated signs was reduced in 2016/17 as only the cost for the poles was incurred not the actual units which were purchased in 2015/16 (2015-16 £7810, 2016-17 £634.38).

As a result of increased expenditure this year, the amount of VAT recoverable has increased from £2,466 in 2015/16 to £6219.3 in 2016/17.

Other reserves equate to £14,198.42 which includes a earmarked reserves for Replacement and Repair of Play Equipment in the Playing Fields of £3,500 and a Community Infrastructure Levy Reserve of £154.17.
