## Report on the Village Hall for May 2012 – April 2013

The Hall continues to be a popular venue for parties and weddings and is almost fully booked the whole year through. The committee does a marvelous job in maintaining the hall to a very high standard. The slabs on the patio to the rear of the hall were becoming loose and dangerous. These have been re-laid and the bench, so kindly donated by the W.I., has been put in place. As the slabs to the front of the hall become slippery, they have been pressure washed. In an effort to avoid accidents a container has been purchased in which to keep sand and salt. Each month there are numerous jobs to see to, and the least pleasant of these, are the toilets that need attention!

The Swop Box, the 24/7 library, previously the telephone box, has proved extremely popular. The scheme was a finalist in the Huntingdon District Council award scheme, but a worthy contender pipped us to the post for first position.
